DSFC provides AI/AN homes with essential drinking water, wastewater and solid waste disposal facilities. As a civil/environmental engineer, you are an invaluable member of the DSFC team. You contribute knowledge and expertise to plan, design, and manage construction of sanitation facilities that advance IHS goals for improving AI/AN health outcomes. Rest easy knowing that IHS has you and your family's insurance needs covered. Insurance coverage may follow you into retirement after 5 years of vested service and maintaining FEHB in the 5 years leading up to retirement (conditions apply).

RETIREMENT BENEFITS

Earn an amazing retirement package including a traditional (defined benefit) federal pension, a 401(k) Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) with employer matched contributions, and Social Security.



CREDIT FOR MILITARY

As an IHS employee, you can choose to carry over eligible military service time that can be added to your total years of creditable service for retirement pension calculation purposes (conditions apply).

Spend time with family and friends with paid leave

Take time off. You will have 13 days paid annual vacation, 13 days paid annual sick leave, and 11 paid federal holidays each year.



Combined Leave

Estimated total annual combined value of paid holidays, sick leave and annual leave (37 days):

Paid Parental Leave

This value estimate does not represent additional compensation, but rather the value of paid time off based on a \$75,000, \$100,000 and \$125,000 annual salary, number of 8-hour days of paid leave and holidays (37).
