- Documented approval of the instructor(s) of the course(s). Attach separate support documentation.

If approved, payment in full (which may include a tuition surcharge or late registration fee) will be due immediately. Upon proof of payment, the course(s) will be added to the student's schedule. If the course(s) listed below are from a semester which has already concluded, it the responsibility of the student to contact the instructor(s) and arrange for the submission of a final grade(s).
